## What is Bullying?



#### WHAT IS BULLYING AND HARASSMENT?

Actions or words, done on purpose, that hurt another person physically or emotionally. It can happen in-person or online.

#### In Virginia, bullying is defined by § 22.1-276.01 as:

"...any <u>aggressive</u> and <u>unwanted behavior that is</u> <u>intended</u> to harm, intimidate, or humiliate the victim; involves a <u>real or perceived power imbalance</u> between the aggressor or aggressors and victim; and <u>is repeated</u> over time or causes severe emotional trauma."

"Bullying" includes cyber bullying.

"Bullying" does not include ordinary teasing, horseplay, argument, or peer conflict.





Report Bullying/Harassment

#### SAY SOMETHING!

Report the situation.

Contact your school or go to the APS website and complete the **Bullying and Harassment** Report form.

#### What happens next?

The report will be sent to your child's principal or school-based administrator. They will let you know they have received it within 24 hours.

The principal or school-based administrator will investigate the report and contact the parents/quardians of the student(s) within 2 school days. They will either share the results or provide an estimate of how many more days the school will need.

#### After the investigation...

Both parties will be contacted in writing with the result of the investigation, any policy violations, and how they may appeal a decision.



## Arlington APS Bullying & Harassment Response Update Schools



- In December of 2024, all APS administrators were trained in updated bullying & harassment investigation and response protocols
- In January of 2025, there were **54 reported investigations** into allegations of bullying and harassment:
  - < 10 were founded cases of bullying</li>
  - < 10 were identified as discriminatory harassment
  - < 10 were referred to the Title IX Coordinator</li>
  - 23% of administrators consulted with DEI & Student Support on an investigation
- Schools at all levels have been teaching the bullying prevention lessons developed in the summer of 2024



### **APS Bullying & Harassment Procedures/Timeline**

#### A Bullying/Harassment Report is Received

#### Within 24 Hours

#### **School administration must:**

- confirm that you received the report
- begin a bullying investigation to gather complete picture of the situation, including conducting student/witness interviews and statements

#### Within 48 Hours

#### **School administration must:**

- provide parents/caregiver of both the complainant and respondent <u>in writing</u>, the following:
  - ☐ the results of their investigation and findings, and
  - ☐ list of supportive measures;
  - discipline (if applicable)or
- provide an update as to progress and expected timeline

The updated B&H response protocol includes:

- A <u>B&H Response Checklist</u> to ensure each step is completed and documented.
- An email template response
- A <u>B/H Investigation and</u>
   <u>Decision-Making Tool</u> to document fact finding and assist in decision making.
- **Findings Decision Letter** templates for all possible outcomes.
- List of Supportive Measures to use as a reference
